



Diploma of Community Welfare Work CHC50702 (AIWCW APPROVED)

Course Code: 061275A (Course includes 400hrs of compulsory field placements over 2 years)

Course Objective

This course is designed for international students who will be involved in classroom training in a full time capacity to gain the qualification. Workers in this role are usually involved in service delivery, either direct client work and/or health promotion and community development projects. Workers at this level operate at an advanced skill level and may also have responsibility for the supervision of other staff and volunteers.

Qualifications

Students successfully completing the course will receive the CHC50702 - Diploma in Community Welfare Work. Participants are provided with advice on employment and further training options throughout the delivery of the program.

Admission Requirements and Prerequisite

To gain entry to this course, participants should have successfully completed year 12 or VCE (Australian Qualification) equivalent. Also mature age entry is available for mature and experienced persons. Relevant work/life experience will be highly regarded. Mature selection will depend upon the applicant's maturity, interpersonal skills, ability to think analytically and understanding of the welfare industry. An IELTS score of 5.5 (or equivalent) is required for entry into this program.

Course Duration

Course is offered full time for TWO YEARS or 104 weeks or part time equivalent for local students.
